Note	Undergraduate students admitted to the University in or after Academic Year 2026 are required to fulfill all of the following requirements during the prescribed duration of study to be eligible for graduation: I. Earning the number of course credits required by their major department;			



- II. Completing one required cornerstone course offered by another college and earning a passing score; the credits earned from this course may be counted toward the Liberal Arts Education category, up to a maximum of four credits;
- III. Fulfilling one of the University's English proficiency requirements for graduation by submitting a valid test report recognized by the University;
- IV. Interdisciplinary Learning: Completing a minor or a secondary major recognized by the University, or completing an interdisciplinary credit program or micro-credit program offered by the University and obtaining a certificate of completion issued by the program; and
- V. Obtaining certificates or licenses recognized by their major department in accordance with its regulations and rules governing professional certification, as part of the graduation requirements.
